It was a great display of hospitality from faculty members and college students, some of whom have been regular guests at the Oaks Indian Mission. This, however, marking the first time we had visited their campus.

With this partnership growing each year, there is a real opportunity for graduates of the Oaks Mission School to attend college there. Though a long way from Oaks, there is a ready support system in place now, which could be very advantageous for kids willing to accept such a challenge.

Progress is moving along on the vocational education facility here on campus—in fact, the concrete flooring was poured and the big sliding doors installed earlier this month.

We are also pleased to report that, in addition to a grant from the Reformation Endowment Fund out of Wichita, as well as a Mission Festival gift from Zion Lutheran in Johnson, Nebraska and a gift from the Phil & Florence Larsen Family in Blair, Nebraska, this

new facility will greatly benefit from the Immanuel Vision Foundation grant this year, funds that will help supply a security system, quality vocational education equipment and stipends to cover instructional costs.

In other words, we are well on our way to providing an excellent educational program in vocational training, skills that will prepare our kids for further vocational training toward a career path and skills that will serve them well in life no matter what vocation they choose to pursue.

And, speaking of projects, we are pleased to announce that the groundwork for laying the foundation of the new cottage is complete and the next phase to commence soon. Not only the campus, but the entire community is abuzz over the first major construction in years here at Oaks. We dare say, it has given this town a renewed sense of confidence in the future. This community with its rich heritage now expectant about what possibilities tomorrow holds.

The craft building is back in business. Kiowa, our resident artist, has taken a lead in sprucing up the interior with a new paint job, etc. New staff members, McKenna and LeaAnn, also applied a lot of elbow grease in the cleaning. The kiln will soon be fired up and various items crafted. We have been blessed with many gifts of molds just waiting to be put to good use. Prayer stones, like the one shown, is a popular

"craft project. Plans are being made to include work on ceramic tile as well as bead- making. Excitement is spreading about the possibilities.





Alex, our award-winning wrestler, has given us a lot to celebrate with his recent accomplishments on the mat. The medal he's displaying in the accompanying photo was for first place in the heavyweight division at a big meet in Muskogee. Alex has been competitive in every match he's entered, sometimes grappling with an

opponent fifty pounds heavier. We're very proud of Alex and look forward to cheering him on in the future.

We celebrate, as well, the fact Jordan, a Junior, scored high enough on a recent ACT test to qualify for admission into college course work at Northeastern State University in nearby Tahlequah this coming Fall semester, during her Senior year, marking a huge boost forward as she prepares for her college career.

This past Fall a group of former residents of the Oaks Indian Mission, joined by a staff member, visited a group of southern Nebraska farmers who years ago, in the 1950's and 60's, hosted boys from the Mission for the summer in exchange for farm work.

It was an experience neither the farmers and their families nor the boys forgot. It shaped memories that would last their entire life. So that, when Simeon Gipson and Kenneth Jensby, pictured here, got together to share some of those memories, it became a special moment, a time to catch up on all those intervening years. And to celebrate the impression those summers so long ago had made upon the lives of those involved, both Mission kids and farm families.
